1)In the salty waters of a red mangrove swamp in Guadeloupe, Lesser Antilles, scientists have found a massive white bacterium known as "Thiomargarita Magnifica Bacteria" on decaying leaves.

- The volume of a typical bacterium typically ranges from 0.4 to 3 m3. It can only be seen using a strong compound microscope with numerous objective lenses.
- The levels of magnification can be increased by switching between these lenses. Up to the most recent discoveries, bacteria were thought to be microscopic or microbiological entities.
- The discovery of Thiomargarita Magnifica contradicts all preconceived notions because it can be seen with the unaided eye.

1)Sydney McLaughlin, an Olympic champion, breaks her own 400-meter hurdles world record.

- At the American championships in Eugene, Oregon, Olympic gold medalist Sydney McLaughlin shattered her own women's 400-meter hurdles world record by taking the title in 51.41 seconds.
